Attendees should stay home or in their hotel room if they have **knowingly** been exposed to an individual with COVID-19, and/or are currently displaying any symptoms associated with COVID-19. The host site has certified Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) and/or a Registered Nurse (RN) onsite.
